Markham Telehandler Certification - A telehandler certification program could be taken by potential operators who have previous experience with driving standard forklifts and for individuals with no previous experiences on a lift truck. The real-world training provided by these courses produces graduates well versed in the right and safe use of these kinds of equipment.

Telehandler certification courses are offered in two forms: at a training facility; at the job site of the trainee. With the former alternative, the manufacturer could work with a licensing agency to bring individuals to a training facility. This option provides trainees with the opportunity to learn to use the machines in a controlled environment. Upon completion, those who participated are given a license or certification to use this type of machine.

When the training is done on the worksite, a skilled instructor is sent to the work place. This is the best way to make certain that your employees receive particular training on the machines that they would be working with, helping to train the trainee in their own work setting. Trainees learn about possible dangerous cases which could occur on the actual work site. The instruction focuses on whichever conditions that are specific to the work location, allowing operators to be prepared to safely handle these elements.

"Telehandler" is an abbreviated version of the term "telescopic handler," which references the machines extending or telescoping arm supporting a fork. The controls and characteristics of the telehandler are quite like a lift truck. A telehandler has the capability of transporting and lifting loads up and away from the vehicle. Wrong utilization of telehandlers could cause serious accidents. If load restrictions are exceeded, the machine can tip because of excess weight on the lift. It is an operator's task to understand load limitations and to utilize these equipment safely.

"Conversion" classes are designed for operators who have been certified to utilize a forklift. These conversion classes would teach the differences between the operation of a telehandler and a forklift, all the while trying to prevent repetitive information that the forklift operator is already familiar with. For trainees who have no past experience using telehandler machinery, training includes the basic utilization and operation of the machinery. Some organizations provide refresher courses also.
