Legislation provides rules for the safe operation, inspection and maintenance of lifting machines all around North America. Accredited operators are needed to run and operate articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity. The articulated crane operator has to have knowledge regarding the various operational features and characteristics of the machinery. Prior to use, a pre-operational equipment check should be performed. There is a legal requirement to carry out a pre-operational inspection and a check of the overhead conditions and work-site ground.

The instructions provided in the manufacturer handbook gives information about maintenance, inspection, and unloading and loading operations. Based on legislation, annual and daily checks are mandatory. Drivers are required to maintain an up-to-date logbook within most places. They may be needed to certify equipment warranties.

Adding remote control devices to the cranes is usually recommended. Remote control improves safety by allowing the driver an easier option for handling the crane.

Prioritizing crane safety helps a company's bottom line. Businesses that follow safe machine practices usually enjoy greater cost savings as opposed to those that don't. The possibility of equipment damage and personal injury is greatly lessened when a driver who is well-trained is handling the crane. Safety conscious operators are more productive leading to less times required for unloading and loading.
