The in-depth training that follows particular machine is needed because much of the work occurs in hazardous scenarios and hazardous scenes so the operator should be able to make sure of a safe working setting all the time. The safety training is vital together with the communications training that helps the crew on the ground be able to communicate with the operator at all times.

Due to the extreme environments these machines work under, they are often put under incredible strain regularly. This means there are a lot of heavy equipment jobs available for the repair and maintenance of the machines. Operators of heavy machines are really skilled workers who are able to troubleshoot, repair and diagnose heavy machines in a work shop or on site. Mechanics should be available to transport their tools to a job site and carry out repair and maintenance in various conditions.

On occasion it may be possible for delivery drivers to operate equipment with just a simple CDL. However, various jobs would require more specific training. Drivers that need to handle huge machines or components for construction projects will require the heavy equipment operator to finish further training. Usually, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles usually escort the delivery truck to its destination.
