Markham Telehandler Training Courses - Employers are responsible for making sure that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work competently utilizing telehandler machines. The skill level of employees have to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that employees attain the needed level of skill. The level of responsibility of the person has to be considered when training is offered. Effective training would remedy whichever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period would determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, the utilization of rotating machines or making use of other attachments. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance like any other equipment. The machine would wear out sooner or later, so correct maintenance is required to ensure the safe utilization of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are vital to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to monitor, prevent and rectify problems associated with deterioration, damage and wear. Workers require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machinery along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use checks are usually performed by the user, whilst general maintenance is normally carried out by the telehandler owner.
